Job Title:	Bridge Club Program Assistant
Purpose:	As a Youth Program Assistant for Bridge Club, you will have the opportunity to make a difference in the lives of immigrant and refugee children (Grades 1 – 6) . This is your chance to help children integrate into Canadian life, make new friends, and feel like they belong. You can achieve this by bringing your unique skills and personality traits to our diverse team. We encourage you to be enthusiastic, be accountable, and lead by example.
Duties & Responsibilities:	 Assist, prepare, and participate in activities with youth and staff, in the classroom, gymnasium, field trips, and community events as directed by program staff Ensure the well-being of all participants by creating and maintaining a safe learning environment Be a positive role model by showcasing leadership skills and building relationships with students Ensure all program participants are treated with respect and integrity Attend training, as required
Time Requirement:	Volunteers are required to work to at least one weekly shift of 2.5 to 3 hours (between 2 pm to 6 pm) for the entire Fall and/or Winter-Spring term Fall Term: Early October to mid-December (11 weeks) Winter-Spring Term: Late January to end of May (16 weeks)

Skills & Qualifications:	 Must be outgoing; able to approach youth to initiate conversation and relationship Must be comfortable to work in a diverse and multicultural setting Must be responsible to getting to and from their volunteer location on their own and on time Must be 15 years old or older. Comfortable working with elementary students
