

The Calgary Bridge Foundation for Youth provides a welcoming and inclusive environment for immigrant and refugee youth and their families by enriching them with the appropriate information, knowledge and experience as they build a life in Canada. The Functional English Conversation Classes (FECC) is targeted at newcomers and refugees with limited English language skills during the early transitionary period of their life in Canada. Its aim is to provide a sense of community, an introduction to Canada and Calgary, and to provide functional English language skills with a focus on listening and speaking.

Under the direction of the In-School Settlement Program Supervisor and FECC Teacher, ELL Tutor Volunteers will be responsible for assisting the FECC Teacher and students in the classroom. Volunteers will work to support instruction on an individual or small group basis to reinforce the curriculum.
