Job Title:	Homework Club Tutor Assistant
Purpose:	As a Tutor Assistant for the Homework Club, you will have the opportunity to make a difference in the lives of immigrant and refugee youth (Grades 1 – 9) by providing homework help and academic support in all subjects. We look for energized, driven, and approachable volunteers who can support the youth while serving as a positive role model that students can look up to. The homework club is offered in selected public libraries and housing units.
Duties & Responsibilities:	<ol> <li>Tutor students (Grades 1 – 9) in Math, Sciences, Social Studies and English/ Language Arts</li> <li>Facilitate English conversation, writing, and reading development among immigrant and refugee youth</li> <li>Assist, prepare, and participate in activities with youth and staff, in the classroom, field trips, and community events</li> <li>Ensure the well-being of all participants by creating and maintaining a safe learning environment</li> <li>Ensure all program participants are treated with respect and integrity</li> <li>Be a positive role model by showcasing leadership skills and building relationships with students</li> <li>Attend training, as required</li> </ol>
Time Requirement:	Volunteers are required to work to at least one weekly shift of 2.5 to 3 hours (between 2 pm to 6 pm) for the entire Fall and/or Winter-Spring term  Fall Term: Early October to mid-December (11 weeks)  Winter-Spring Term: Late January to end of May (16 weeks)

Skills & Qualifications:	<ul> <li>Must be comfortable to work in a diverse and multicultural setting</li> <li>Must be empathetic, organized, and patient when interacting with immigrant and refugee high school youth</li> <li>Must be comfortable in tutoring two or more of the following subjects: Mathematics, Calculus, Physics, Chemistry, Biology, Social Studies, and English</li> <li>Must be responsible to getting to and from their volunteer location on their own and on time</li> <li>Must be 18 years old or older</li> </ul>
