Part-time Tutor - RBC Youth Empowerment Program

The Calgary Bridge Foundation for Youth (CBFY) is a charitable not for profit youth focused family centered hub that gives power of voice to immigrant and refugee children, youth and families. CBFY is in its 30th year of services and is a core leader within the youth domain in the Calgary settlement and integration sector. CBFY works in collaboration with the two public schools in Calgary, Calgary Board of Education and Calgary Catholic School district to ensure that youth and their families are equitably engaged to thrive and not merely to survive. In any given year the organization supports over 13,000 individuals.

Five factors are critical to CBFY's future success. These are 1) quality and sustainability of programming, 2) accessibility to families and individuals, and presence in the community, 3) engaged employees and volunteers, 4) accurately and credibly measured outcomes and 5) impact and expand capacity to meet the need. Employees are evaluated on organizational priorities and the following competencies, measurement, decision making, communication, continuous learning and positive relationships.

About the position:

Under the direction of the Afterschool Program (ASP) Manager, ASP Supervisor and the ASP Coordinators, the RBC Tutor will be responsible for tutoring immigrant and refugee youth clients of the Calgary Bridge Foundation for Youth.

Scope of Duties and Responsibilities:

Planning and organization

- Tutor small groups of high school youth in one or more of the Alberta Senior High School curriculum subjects: Math, Sciences, Social Studies, and English/ Language Arts
- Create engaging workshops and facilitating to develop life skills
- Lead and oversee program participants on occasional field trips.
- Engage youth, build positive and respectful relationships by providing inspiration, support and guidance.
- Assist in maintaining accurate program records including incident reports and attendance.
- Ensure all program participants are treated with respect and integrity by fostering a safe environment where participants are encouraged to try new things.
- Support program participants by providing leadership and life skills.
- Ensure the safety and well-being of all youth in the program, including group and/or individual behaviour management and support.
- Ensure that the rules, regulations and policies of the Calgary Bridge Foundation for Youth, the Calgary Board of Education and the Catholic School District are adhered to.
- Support program staff in ensuring that client files are kept up to date and confidential.

Supervision

- Ensure the safety and well-being of assigned classroom group at all times.
- Ensure the physical and mental well-being of all program participants.
- Supervise and lead program participants' during off-site field trips.
- Provide ASP Supervisor/ Coordinators with feedback regarding the needs of program participants.

Other

- Create and maintain positive relationships with parents, school contacts, and community partners.

The duties and responsibilities outlined above are representative but not all inclusive. Other related duties as required.



Hours of Work: Shifts available Monday through Thursday (between 3:15 PM- 6:00 PM) and occasional weekends. Up to 25 hours per week.

Qualifications & Requirements:

- Preference will be given to applicants who have completed or are pursuing a degree/diploma in education, social work, human services or a related discipline.
- Preference given to applicants who can tutor Math, Physics, Biology, Chemistry, ELA, and Social Studies
- Must have tutoring experience and expertise in the Alberta curriculum at the High School level
- Previous experience working with refugee and newcomer populations preferred.
- Previous experience working with immigrant families from diverse cultural and linguistic backgrounds. Fluency in another language other than English will be considered an asset
- Advanced written and spoken English.
- Previous experience facilitating and presenting to small and large youth groups.
- Reliable means of transportation to get to program locations.
- Current Standard First-Aid CPR C with AED certificate or willingness to obtain one prior to commencement of employment.
- Police Clearance or willingness to obtain one prior to commencement of employment.
- Child Intervention Check Clearance or willingness to obtain one prior to commencement of employment.
- Must be available to attend mandatory paid trainings.
- Candidate must be flexible to work in a hybrid environment (virtual and in-person)
- Must be able to work at least 2 shifts per week
